About This Course

The qualification prepares learners to become Early Years Educators, enabling you to work with children from birth to 5 years in this Early Years sector. Upon successful completion of the course the T level gives a license to practice for the industry, whilst also providing a direct route onto a University course.

Through attending placement, you'll develop a range of employability skills such as timekeeping, teamwork, organisational skills, planning and delivering a range of activities to meet the curriculum, record keeping, assessing children's development and recording this on the child's profile, partnership working and safeguarding.

What Will I Study?
